# Honoring the Grand Master

ANTEI: At the behest of the Star Chamber the Dark Council, Clan Summits and several prominent members of the Dark Brotherhood, most noticeably Lord Thedek, Prophet Telaris Taldrya, Master Alanna Taldrya, Master Gui-Long and Adept Quiritatio Entar, were summoned to a private ceremony deep in the Dark Hall early on the anniversary of the Exodus.

Lord Cotelin's award comes after almost eighteen months in office, three years in Galactic Standard, during which time he has seen no recognition for his service. This period has seen the Grand Master lead the Dark Brotherhood through the K'hamar'a and Coratua campaigns, as well as the revival of the Grand Master's Royal Guard, the consolidation of the Clans and amalgamation of the Dark Council together with the appointment of the Tribunes. He has also personally spearheaded several major improvements to Dark Hall

HoloNet mainframe and continues to do so in conjunction with the Seneschal.

Of course, to only consider Lord Cotelin's time as Grand Master would be unfair. Indeed his last major reward was not since back during his service as Deputy Grand Master under Lord Firefox. Since then Lord Cotelin has selflessly provided the Dark Council with his guidance and leadership.

"Any Dark Council member who has used his position to help the growth and function of the Brotherhood by aiding the Orders and the Lower Clans."

During this battle Acara and Manesh continued to bomb the perimeter of the facility, keeping the ground-based troops occupied during the carrier's landing. The Brotherhood troops, along with their Dark Jedi escorts, disembarked and began the task of clearing the facility, taking key personnel prisoner and killing the rest.

Commandant Jem'Hakkhar tried to flee the scene in a Z-95 headhunter, but Revenant managed to disable his engines and was caught on the ground.

The prisoners were taken to Jezra, the Harkin capital, where they were publicly flogged and executed. When questioned about brutality and humiliation techniques, Revenant replied only that "it is important that the will of Darth Cotelin is enforced. It is more important that it is *seen* to be enforced".

And so the invasion continues. It will not be long before the entire planet of Antei is consolidated under the rule of the Dark Jedi Brotherhood.

# The Shadow Academy Then, Now and the Future

Commentary from the new Headmaster

I was speaking with a younger member of the Brotherhood the other day. It started off as a talk about proposed Shadow Academy courses, but it progressed into how long I'd been in the Brotherhood, how I got to Headmaster, and how the Brotherhood got to where we are today. I started to think back on how much things have changed, especially in the Shadow Academy. Then I got to thinking "hey, this would make a decent Exodus article, and I can let everyone know what I'm planning for the Shadow Academy."

I joined the Brotherhood back in 1999. I'm fairly certain Thedek was Grand Master at the time, but don't hold me to that. I am by no means the oldest member in the Brotherhood, but time and the split from the Emperor's Hammer have made me one of the elder members, at least in time in the Brotherhood. The Shadow Academy was drastically different back then. The Brotherhood was rigidly divided into orders, and each order had its specific activities. This is why I'm a Krath: because, at the time, all I could do was write fiction, as I did not possess any of the Star Wars games. The Shadow Academy was required and there were four things you had to do. Everyone took the Test of Lore, as they still do today. I also had to submit a character history, submit a poem, and submit a short story. These four things were required, but after each one, you got a promotion.

When all was said and done, you left the academy at the rank of Guardian and got involved in your house and clan.

Upon completion, you also got a "graduation certificate," which was actually a graphic made that looked like a diploma of sorts. I do not have it, I don't even think I saved it, but you did get one back then. Having these four requirements is what constituted the CORE, and up until a few years ago, SA: CORE was present in my ID line, and probably a few other older members as well. But, once you completed that, you were largely done with the Shadow Academy and you did not go back. Though I was too young in the Brotherhood to know it, I would be willing to bet that all the grading was done by the Headmaster and his Praetor.

As time went on, more courses were added to the General Studies and Order-specific courses were added, greatly increasing what could be done at the Shadow Academy. Some of these courses, like the Test of Wisdom, Test of Agility, and Test of Endurance were simply the old exams that had been required as part of the CORE. The Shadow Academy has not stopped growing since then. Under Pyralis, the title of Eclectic Pedagogue was officially added and the Envoys, through Project Dark Fury, were established as they exist today. The promotional ability of the Shadow Academy has been limited; you can now only get to the rank of Protector, and it is not even required to go that route. The Shadow Academy offers a wide variety of courses these days, some very general, others still oriented towards the Orders. The Shadow Academy today, and the Academy of the future, will largely be an area for academic growth, to the extent that there an academic realm of the Brotherhood and Star Wars. The clans are where your practical experience will come from (clans, of course, should reward for efforts at the Shadow Academy).

The Split from the Emperor's Hammer did not change the Shadow Academy, nor did it impede its growth. But, the Split guaranteed that some changes would come to the Shadow Academy, and this is where we find ourselves today. Just about every course has been altered to eliminate references to the Emperor's Hammer, as well as to update information. The elimination of strict orders, and subsequent elimination of order leaders, has brought about the need to further edit courses. Other courses, such as the Imperial and Enemy fighter courses are also outdated. There is a lot of work to do; here is just some of what is planned.

There are a lot of updates. A new career guide with history creation guidelines is being worked on, and these guidelines are almost complete. All courses are in the process of being audited and updated. The core tests are being rewritten and reorganized to provide a better understanding of how the orders fit into the Brotherhood today.

The ISET and ESET are going to be replaced by two new exams, one focusing on fighters and freighters, and the other focusing on capital starships. In terms of organization, I would like to organize the Shadow Academy by activity rather than order (this was not my original idea, but I like it). While many of the courses will not change location (and indeed, they will help emphasize the fictional traits of a certain order), some courses will be placed differently. Here's an example. Currently, there is a Sith Alchemy course, and it is listed under General Studies. Under the new system, the Sith Alchemy course will be moved to what is tentatively called the School of Lore and Philosophy (the Deneba Campus). While many of the courses in this school will be more oriented towards the Krath Order, which is in the Brotherhood the more mystical and academic order, not every course will be Krath oriented. A School of Flight and Tactics and a School of Melee and Ground Combat will also be added. The courses that don't really fit into any of these will be left as General Studies (on the main campus). Finally, a new and better looking Shadow Academy website is under construction.

As previously mentioned, the Shadow Academy will largely be an academic entity, aimed at providing information about the Star Wars universe, the Brotherhood, and some more practical things, like the coding and communications courses. It will still help you to advance, of course. While Spears was Headmaster, in a little over 1.5 years, 5,000+courses were passed. There will always be growth in the Shadow Academy. Even as I write this, I know of four potential new courses that have been proposed or are on people's minds; I'm waiting for the detailed proposals with notes and exams on two of them. The organization that I want to pursue will help emphasize the fictional aspects of the Brotherhood, something that is, in my opinion, a vital part of the Brotherhood.

I hope you enjoyed the trip down memory lane, and I hope that you're interested in what the Shadow Academy has to offer to you as an individual, and to the Brotherhood as a whole. I am always open for comments and suggestions from any member.

# The Krath: Philosophies and Purpose in the New Order

There are practitioners of the Dark Side who look to their compatriots in the Krath Order and sneer. They stand glistening in their armor or huddle conspiring in dark corners. Always do they bask in their own hubris, unknowing that it is the ritual power practiced by the Krath that enables them to achieve their glorious feats. The Obelisk will look to his strength and martial prowess and say: "What need have I for the tomes and chants of the priestly Krath?" The Sith sitting upon their thrones of blood will say: "I, and I alone, wield the power to command the universe."

Traditionally the Sith would play their games of power, plotting and planning, possibly even scheming within the wheels of governments, businesses, religious orders, and military regimes to gain power in any manner possible. They maintained that they alone were the true heirs to the mantle of power held by the Dark Jedi, that it was they that seized the throne of the Galactic Empire, and therefore it should be they who bring about the next age of Darkness. The Sith look down upon the Krath as weak scribes and bookworms, condemning us for our apparent lack of ambition and unwillingness to engage in the game of thrones.

The Obelisk hold even more disdain for the Krath than the Sith do, which in itself is hard to believe. Yet in the midst of battle while weapons rise and fall and men lose their lives, those of the Cerulean order still find time to offend their brethren in the Krath. They berate us for not standing in the front lines of a charge, but never take into account that several of the finest warriors of the Brotherhood hail from the Krath order. The Obelisk are content to believe that the only combatants in the Brotherhood are they, and it is only through their actions that battles and ultimately wars are won.

To this the educated Krath can only smile in the knowledge that it is their power, prayer and diligent practice that has augmented the powers of their brethren in the Sith and Obelisk. It is through the intercessions of the dark spirits of the Dread Lords, through diligent study and observation, and finally the crafting of talismans, wards, sigils and other imbued artifacts that the night is won, not just through the clumsy machinations of the Sith politicians nor of the brutish fumbling of the Obelisk warriors. The Krath are well aware that there is a place for their sister orders, yet recognize that the whole of the Dark Brotherhood is more than the sum of her parts. For the Empire of Darkness to be truly resurrected the three must act as one.

Always with this in mind does the Krath enter into their dangerous work, for the workings of the Dark Side are dangerous, indeed. Calling upon the spirits of long dead Sith Lords is not a vocation for the reserved, where a single mispronounced syllable or forgotten gesture can lead to death or worse. This mineral is found in areas that once contained extensive radionuclide deposits, and these deposits may have acted as natural fission reactors. We came across commoners mining the raw deposit for radiological material.

### Overview

The mineral generally appears as a hexagonal bipyramidal form, of the 6/m crystal point group. Lesser crystals of a simple hexagonal prism shape occur also. However, the only usable nova crystal found so far was of the more complex shape. The crystals appear as universally yellow in color, ranging from a honey brown to a light golden hue. The mineral seems similar in composition to beryl, although Scandium substituted for most of the Beryllium atoms in the chains.

The deposits themselves contained high amounts of Uranium 235, and apparently natural ground water circulation acted as a neutron moderator for the activity of the deposit. The Kyatrium crystals were bathed in radiation and heavy mineral salt solutions, thus making them slightly radioactive. They appear to be igneous and of alpine type hydrothermal origin.

Judging from an isotopic trapped Xenon pocket analysis, the cycle of power versus cool down of this makeshift natural reactor was approximately one-half hour to 2 hours. These vein systems were active for over one billion years, making even the small energy output of the 30-meter wide vein system considerable over historical time. The resulting fission events depleted the U-235, marking the by-products clearly for isotopic analysis.

### Conclusions

Upon experimentation with the crystals, they seem to possess a number of interesting effects. They are unsuitable for use as a power generator crystal in a lightsaber, an effect that was discovered much to the chagrin of the test subject. Detonation was the inevitable result. When used as a nova type focusing crystal, the Kyatrium had interesting effects. The saber thus enabled seemed to be virtually immune to ion weapons, recovering from even high powered shots within nanoseconds. As well, the draw upon the power cell

was proportionately slower, ensuring a much longer usage period per saber recharge.

This mineral dubbed "Kyatrium" bodes further study and experimentation. This nova could be extremely useful for Brotherhood persons operating sabers for extended periods in the field. It may also give clues to the abilities of historical persons that operated their sabers for extended times in the field, such as Quinlan Vos.

# Ecology of the Orbalisk

The parasite known as an Orbalisk is an intriguing creature. These hard-shelled life forms evolved on the Demon Moon of Dxun. Presumably, the influence of the Dark Side seeping from Freedon Nadd's iron tomb caused a native beetle-like creature to evolve into a parasite with unique qualities. In some respects, it resembles a symbiote as well.

Orbalisks attach themselves to the bodies of living creatures, and then drain the energy and fluids of the victim. They also inject an agonizing poison into their victims. This poison can be resisted with the power of the Dark Side, and in fact the Orbalisk seems to feed off of Dark energy. The more steeped in the power of the Dark Side the host, the more likely they are to resist the toxin.

Once the relationship between the host and parasites has become stable the toxin has some other effects. It makes the host stronger, and increases their vitality. It also increases the rate at which they heal. The intermixture of Dark Side energy and Orbalisk venom acts like adrenaline in the system of the host.

They are lightsaber resistant, and thus create a living suit of armor when encasing a life form. The armored pests reproduce and eventually cover the host unless a helmet or barrier is used around the head.

Darth Bane was known to have encountered Orbalisks on Dxun in the Tomb of Freedon Nadd. Bane attempted to remove the creatures, and found it to be very difficult. They resisted his lightsaber, and the wounds healed extremely quickly.

The Sith Lord then decided to master the venom. He created a helmet to protect his face and found himself possessed of a suit of living armor that resisted lightsaber blows, gave him awesome strength, and increased recuperative powers. The Orbalisk is only found on Dxun, thankfully. It would be bad for the galaxy at large if they spread.

# Master at Arms Syn Kaek

When Syn Kaek was appointed Master at Arms the Dark Brotherhood knew that changes were on the horizon. With a dynamic outlook on his position, and an outwardly autocratic managing style, the MAA has been the topic of some criticisms recently by old and new members alike. I recently had the opportunity to sit down with Sith Warlord Syn Kaek, these days he's known as Xu Long, and talk about some of his goals, ideas and what direction he'd like for the Office of the Master at Arms to take in the future of the Dark Brotherhood. I also took a look at some of the lighter aspects of Kaek, the man behind the title.

### Did you have aspirations to become the Master At Arms and if so why?

I've actually been inclined to become MAA since...as far back as I can remember. Since when Thedek was MAA....this was prior to the database existing. I've never understood my own reasons for wanting the job - it always just seemed like something I could do well since my mind tends to be very well adjusted to administrative purposes. Back in the day, I was also younger and more impetuous...this was 6 or 7 years ago. My reasons for wanting to be MAA have changed over the years...today, I mostly want to give back to this club that has given me much pleasure and I'm anxious to ensure that the systems we have in place for member rewards are well organized.

### Now that you have the position what do you see yourself accomplishing?

Already much has been accomplished. Most of the changes are small and were made both while Khan was MAA and now during my tenure. Many of them have been to solve small problems that pop up...some are to satisfy growing needs, like the family census and the Clan title census, and almost all of them are simply paving the way for the large changes. We have major reform/revision projects planned for...quite literally...all aspects of the MAA's office.

### Would you care to elaborate on that?

It's hard to elaborate on exactly what that means....since we're looking at wholesale revision. It doesn't mean we're scrapping everything we have and starting over, it just means we want to reevaluate the system we use so that it better serves the DB populace. On a side note we'll be making a nice guide for people to use as well. My goal is quite simple: I want to make everything clear enough for everyone that my workload virtually disappears. When promotions/medals are written properly, it takes no more than 20 or 30 seconds to review low-level requests...when they are poorly written, it's just not good for everyone. I aim to correct that; and a lot of that correction has to do with educating the membership.

### Do you have any other side projects in the works?

Yes...there are some nefarious ideas. Obviously I will be making small changes continuously.

### Anything you'd like to share with the members?

Well, following the conclusion of most of these large projects there are several other ideas that I have. I'd rather not go into them, since I am absolutely positive that they will be controversial, and while The Grand Master is aware of them and approves of some of them, now is not yet the time to reveal them. Needless to say, the MAA status quo does not exist anymore, as in, changes will be made - I'm not just going to sit and press "Approve/Deny".

# Shortly after taking the position of MAA you came under fire from several directions for your handling of the office. Would you care to respond publicly to anything, or say anything to clarify your position on things such as the "nonexistent status quo"?

It seems to me, most of the criticisms have come because I'm a non-traditional operator. It also seems to me, that most of the criticisms have been from small groups and not the mainstream of the Brotherhood.

### Could you explain the term "non-traditional operator"?

I don't think anyone would say that they want an MAA who simply approves/disapproves of requests, however, many people have become used to that. The fact that I question assertions has offended some individuals who maintain that I have no right to question their statements. This is what I mean by a "non-traditional" operator: I aim to make significant changes to the way things are handled. If my job consists of pressing a button why do we even need to have someone in

my position? The answer is because that's not all my job consists of. I'm supposed to square away everything across all of the Clans and Houses - that means adjusting my thinking to the way every individual leader handles their awards and recommendations. This goes for Clan leadership, House leadership, Battleteam leadership and DC leadership. Some people have accused me of advocating more 'bureaucracy' because I demand more quality from recommendations. However, as I have said on other occasions, I do not consider it unreasonable for me to expect leaders to know what their members have done. Others have brought up the fact that some people are overlooked for awards. I have been looking into a solution for this.

### Is there anyone you consult with if and when you have a difficult decision to make regarding your position?

Well, if I have difficulty making a decision on a medal or a promotion, I'll usually consult with whoever requested it or any related superiors. For higher-level stuff, I will usually automatically consult with the Grandmaster, although he usually leaves the final decision to me, however on general policy changes, I almost always consult the Grandmaster and oftentimes the Dark Summit as well.

### Do you find it difficult to be the sole decision maker or do you enjoy it?

It can be difficult sometimes but it's also enjoyable. On situations where I know my decision will create problems, it's challenging. However, ensuring things are done properly allows me to derive a lot of pleasure from making the right decision. And to be honest being the sole decision maker ensures uniformity...which is a very good thing.

# Do you believe the Dark Brotherhood, as a whole needs to be more authoritarian? Or do you believe our current semi-democratic system works just fine?

The current semi-democratic system works well...in fact, I'm in favor of more democracy. Some people might be surprised to hear that from me, however, with these large reform projects, many members will be surprised at the amount of 'democracy' I intend to inject into this decision making process. Ultimately, in my particular position it will always come back to one person making the call, but the more voices and opinions I hear, the better I can make that call.

### Where do you see yourself DB wise five years from now?

Well, I'll either still be MAA or, more likely, I'll have long since retired. I don't aim to go any higher than this. I don't think I'd be a good DGM or GM, although Firefox's job is quite appealing to me as a law student. Most likely, however, I will retire after I've finished setting up a stable MAA system.

# Let's talk about Kaek the person now. You are a pre-law student? Yes.

What has drawn you to law?

Mostly natural inclination. It's actually one of my career interests to potentially serve as a Judge one day, which fits in quite nicely with my DB position, I'd think.

### What hobbies do you have outside the DB?

Well, most of my time is spent doing college work. I'm also extremely politically active and I spend quite a lot of time working with University administration.

### I know this will get me in trouble but I have to ask...Red or Blue?

I don't answer that question. I like to play my cards close to my chest. Besides that I paintball when I can and am a huge sports fan - I love my trifecta of football, baseball and basketball: never a dull moment.

### What are your teams?

In the NFL, I like the Redskins though I'm not a big NFL man. In the NBA, I'm a Clippers fan ha-ha and I'm an Angels fan for MLB. Plus, in college sports I always root for my school's team, UCLA, and also LSU and Alabama and I absolutely hate Barry Bonds.
